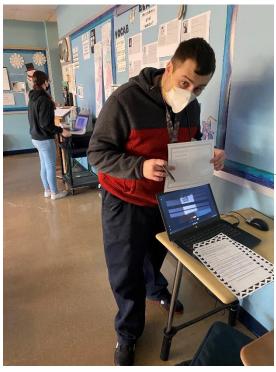

#### **Support for Quarantined Students**

Students who are required to quarantine due to COVID-19 or are out of school for medical reasons are in jeopardy of falling behind academically and need extra support. Below, please find steps quarantined students should follow each day out of school.

- 1. **Log in to the Google Classroom & Google Meet** dedicated to students who are quarantined. Students must log on daily at 10:00 a.m. if they would like to be marked present for that day. We ask for your video on during this brief chick-in. This is optional and other students will be on the call.
  - You will briefly meet with transition counselor assigned to quarantined students, Mrs. Harrington, and this will serve as a check-in while you are out on quarantine.

- 2. Keep up with each of your class's Google Classroom. Please email your individual teacher for work or guidance counselor for assistance.

- 5. Attend EXTENDS and continue to attend virtual help session each night.
  - Utilize Transition Counselor, Mrs. Harrington, for assistance as needed.

  - ➤ Attend virtual homework help sessions Monday Thursday.
