STAR: Standardized Test for the Assessment of Reading

A Parent's Guide

What is STAR?

- A computer-based, customized reading test for students in Grades 1-12
- This test is adaptive
 - As students answer questions, it becomes more or less difficult depending on how a student is scoring
- Students can finish this test in about 30 minutes

What is it used for?

- Teachers use this test to determine the current reading level of students
- Useful in determining where growth is needed
- Teachers can then customize instruction to fit student needs
- Way to measure growth over a school year

When will STAR be administered?

- Freshmen March 2022
- Sophomores April 2022

Your child's teacher will send home a parent report with test results soon after the test has been administered

What information do we look at?

- Scaled Score (SS)
- Percentile Rank (PR)
- Instructional Reading Level (IRL)
- Zone of Proximal Development (ZPR)

Scaled Score (SS):

This score is based on the difficulty of the questions and the number of correct responses. It ranges between 600-1400.

This score is used to determine whether or not a student needs assistance with reading skills.



The Scaled Score is also used to make a determination as to whether or not students are on track to pass the MCAS. This is the most important score that teachers will look at

Parent Report


This is what parents will receive from their child's teacher after the test has been administered

Scaled Score



Percentile Rank


Indicates where the student falls, percentage-wise, out of other students nationally who obtained scores equal to or lower than that student. Percentile rank ranges from 1-99



For this student, a 24 means they scored as well or better than 24% of students tested nationally

Instructional Reading Level


Indicates the level at which the student is reading, based on their test score



This student is reading around a 7th grade level and is moderately proficient at comprehending words at this grade level

Zone of Proximal Development

The ZPD is useful in helping teachers assign appropriate novels to students. This shows a range of readability levels from which a student should select books to read. It is a range that is neither too hard nor too easy, to make sure that students can experience optimal growth




For this student, the ZPD shows that they should be reading novels between a 4.3 and 7.1 grade level range. At this level, the student should be able to comprehend the ideas and words in the novel, as well as improve their reading skills without too much difficulty.

What does the Student Report look like?

This Instructional Planning Report will be uploaded to each students' Aspen documents page, so that current ELA teachers can see their past progress and where students should be headed in terms of reading

comprehension



What next?

- Current sophomore students will have last year's scores input in Aspen (coming soon!)
- Sophomore instructors will be able to view these scores and tailor curriculum
- Sophomores will take the test again in the spring and results will be compared over the course of their two years
- Current freshmen will take this test in the spring
